Pull the batteries from your machine(s)

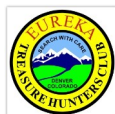
Remove the coil cover and clean both the coil and cover.

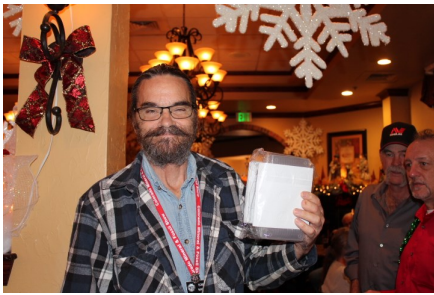

downtown high rises.

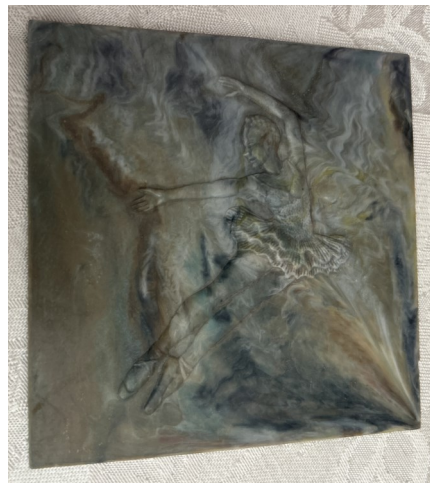
After 11 years I opened my own commercial plumbing shop but after 10 months I realized I did not have the capital nor desire to continue on.

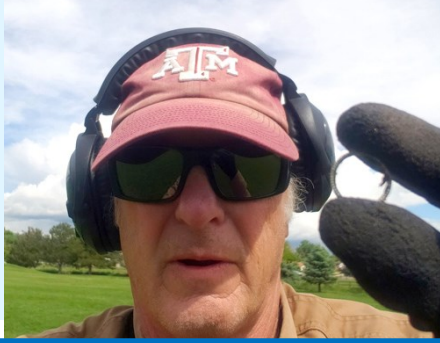

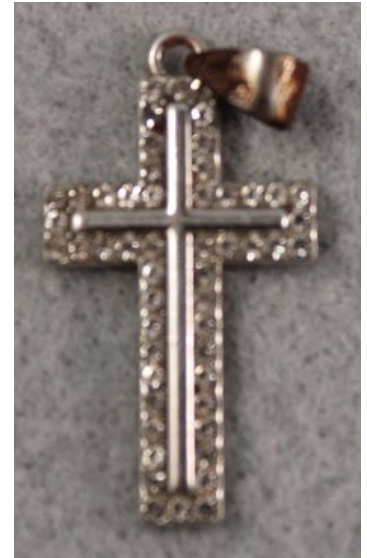

Jewelry: objects of metal often set with gems and worn for personal adornment, except jewelry qualifying for the Gold Category.

Coin: a piece of metal issued by governmental authority as money.

Token: a piece resembling a coin issued by some person or entity, not of a governmental authority (with the exception of tax tokens), that could be redeemed for services or specified items. Advertisement tokens with no redeemable value are entered in the Artifact Category.

Artifact: simple object showing human workmanship or modification, and all other items that do not meet the criteria for other categories.

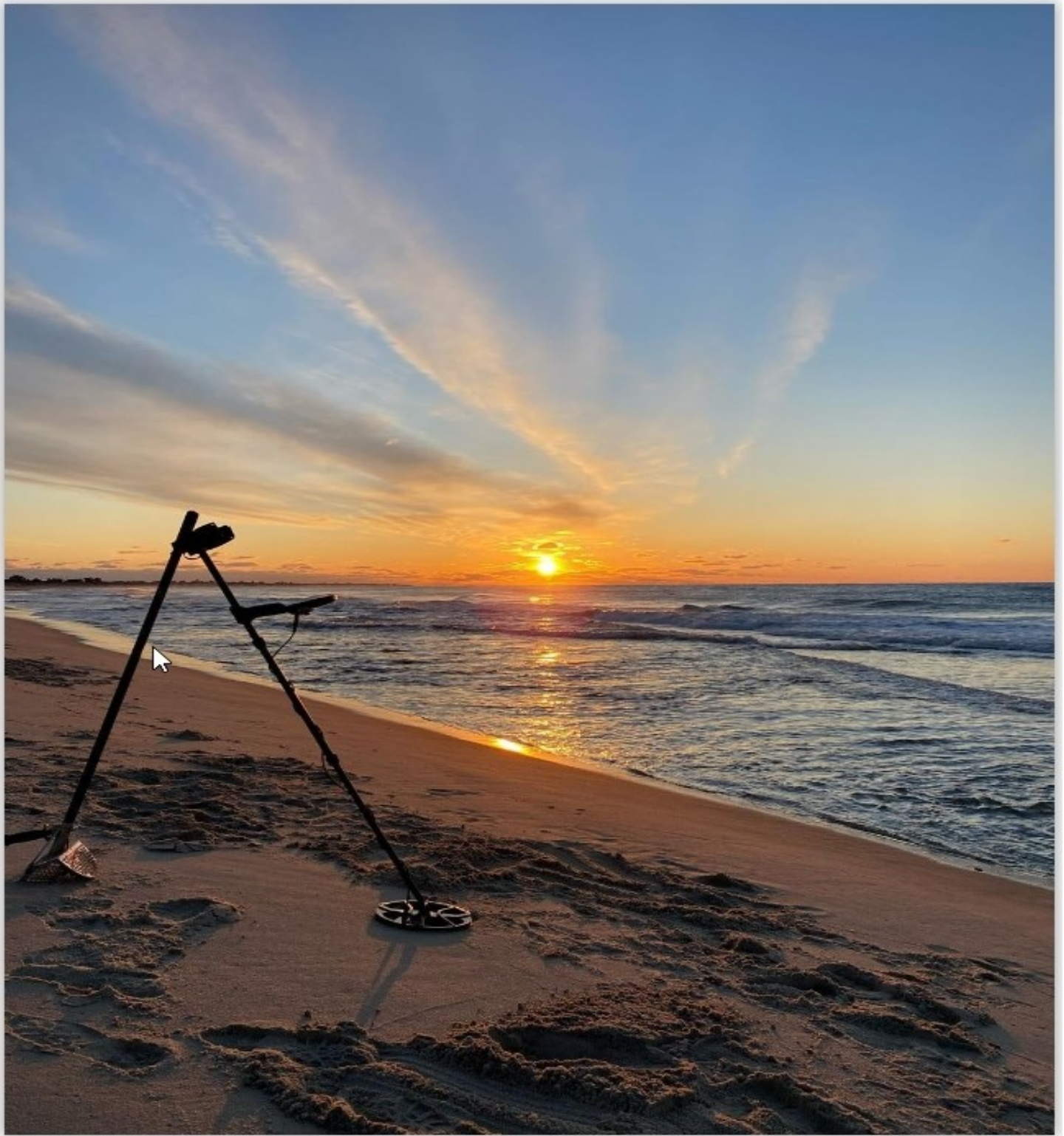
About Eureka!
